Introduction

Putting prevention at the heart of our actions!

Addiction to alcohol, cannabis and other drugs, tobacco and vaping products, problematic Internet or screen use and gambling affects not only the individual, but also their friends and family, community and society as a whole. Therefore, addiction is a problem that concerns us all, socially and collectively.

The Public Health Branch (PHB) of the CISSS de l'Outaouais provides leadership for regional consultations, called the *Comité régional en prévention des dépendances (CRPD)*, bringing together various community, school and health and social services stakeholders. The strength of this committee lies in the collaboration, commitment and contribution of all, as well as the mutual recognition of expertise.

Knowledge of addiction prevention and treatment resources in the Outaouais region and an understanding of the role and services offered by each partner enables the local population to be better directed to the right services. This facilitates resource optimization and the collaboration of not only RAPC caseworkers, but also other partners, such as schools, communities and municipalities, in support of various initiatives.

2025 Outaouais Addiction Resources Directory

At the beginning of the **Addiction Resources Directory**, a summary table is provided to make it easier to search for addiction services offered by Outaouais organizations or the CISSS de l'Outaouais:

- Organizations in each area: Pontiac, Vallée-de-la-Gatineau, Vallée-de-la-Lièvre and Petite-Nation, Collines-de-l'Outaouais and Gatineau
- Regional organizations: services offered throughout the Outaouais region
- Addiction services offered by the CISSS de l'Outaouais

The services offered by each organization with an addiction prevention mandate are then presented, followed by the CISSS de l'Outaouais's addiction treatment services.

There are two other sections in the *Addiction Resources Directory:*

- **Information Sources for Addiction Workers:** organizations, associations, centres and research groups providing information on addiction, intervention options or training.
- Help and Information Resources for Outaouais Residents: to find help resources for addiction.
 Icons, representing the types of addictions and the different services offered, are provided in this section.

The **2025 Addiction Resources Directory** is the result of significant reflection, mobilization and a common desire to prevent addiction in the Outaouais region and to support everyone in finding the help they need. It is a collective, constantly evolving document.
